**Did You Know...?** That "over a 50-year lifetime, a tree generates \$31,250 of oxygen, provides \$62,000 worth of air pollution control, recycles \$37,500 worth of water and controls \$31, 250 worth of soil control."

That a walk in nature improves memory! Do you remember those days before you HAD to keep a list, when you remembered everything? A walk in the park, the woods, or the arboretum might be just the thing you need. New research out of the University of Michigan shows that scenic settings (as opposed to urban ones) actually renew and replenish cognitive control cente rs. Study participants who took 20 -minute walks in an arboretum performed 20% higher on standa rd memory and attention tasks than those who walked through a typical downtown urban setting.

Home Renovation Tax Credit — eligibility period is between January 27, 2009 and February 1, 2010. The 15% credit is calculated on the portion of eligible expens es exceeding \$1000, but no more than \$10,000. The maximum credit that you can receive is \$1350. Things such as laying new sod, purchasing trees, shrubs and perennials, retaining walls, pathways and decks, ponds and waterfalls, garden sheds, irrigation an — d lighting systems, professional landscape design service and professional landscape contractors services are all eligible for the tax credit. # To Do List for September/October

<b>√</b>	This is the last chance to lift, divide and replant irises.	<b>√</b>	Make a list of fall bulbs to acquire and then purchase as required. Plant fall bulbs as soon as possible.	
<b>√</b>	Continue weeding; place any weeds that have gone to seed in the garbage (not your compost pile).	<b>√</b>	Following overnight frosts, mist tender flowers with sprinkler before the sun touches them; you may save some.	
<b>√</b>	Deadhead annuals and some perennials for continued bloom. Some decorative seed heads can be left.	✓	Cut flowers that preserve well and save them for winter containers. Globe thistle, baby's breath and nigella all preserve well.	
<b>√</b>	Continue fertilizing annual plantings and containers.		This is a great time to lift, divide and replant irises.	
<b>√</b>	Discontinue fertilizing trees, shrubs, roses and perennials.	✓	Reduce watering, thereby encouraging improved winter hardiness.	
<b>√</b>	Stop deadheading hardy roses in late August.	✓	Take geranium cuttings, etc. before the first frost.	
<b>√</b>	Carefully remove mildewed or black- spotted foliage and place in plastic garbage bags for disposal.	<b>√</b>	To keep containers going as long as possible, cover them or place them indoors if frost is predicted.	
<b>√</b>	Assemble a supply of frost covers. Old towels, sheets, etc. can be used.	✓

Trees, shrubs and perennial planting can still be done with great success. Remember to use a plant starter fertilizer for good root establishment such as CIL Plant Starter 5-15-5 or Plant Prod 10-52-10.


